Contest Description:

In an effort to expand slalom skateboarding with a special focus on the local scene, and to give local skaters experience in a race setting, we are organizing the Huntington-area Outlaw Slalom Series (HOSS). This will consist of several (tentatively one per month) races. Each race will be at a different location. Racers will be awarded series points based on the results of each race. While the focus of these events is expanding the local scene, I also would love to get these races sanctioned and use this as a chance to get skaters from out of town to come race with us to accomplish two major tasks: a) introduce local skaters to the slalom scene at-large, b) learn from the different scenes. On a personal note, I'm using this series to practice organizing races in preparation for the "big race" I'm organizing, the Kentucky Fried Cone Fest, in September.

This will be a single-lane GS race with cones spaced pretty far apart.
