Smooth long asphalt hill with uphill run out.		
Venue attractions (local attractions for non-skaters):		
European Drifting Championships and Time Attack - a 'beat the clock' challenge for highly tuned road cars – will be taking place on the Indy Circuit. There will also be demo laps from 1000bhp race trucks, stunt motorcycles and Santa Pod drag cars plus much more.		
Media Coverage:		
Media companies (From UKSSA's contacts list) will receive details of the event via press releases issued regularly in the months leading up to the race. The events on the Indy Circuit are being televised. On Saturday evening after racing has finished on the Indy Circuit (at around 6pm) we have been invited to put on some demo races for the Time Attack spectators in the grandstands using Paddock Hill Bend. The format for these will be decided on nearer the time.

Camping available @ £15 per person. Local hotels – although these tend to be booked up very quickly on race weekends. Food available various stalls and snack wagons all over the site.

Contest Description:

Slalom races have been held at Brands Hatch since the Early 1980's. The UKSSA have not staged a race here since 2005 so this year sees our return to this revered spot. The organizers of the Time Attack event have been very supportive and have agreed that if all goes well with this race we will be invited back as a regular fixture. Brands Hatch has all amenities on site and is a great race location steeped in history, Hawthorn Hill was also where Martin Sweeney set the World record for 100 cones back in 1991 a record that stood until just recently and still the most watched slalom clip on the internet.

The UKSSA run well organized fun races and enjoy hosting racers from all over Europe regularly. Richy and Maria Carrasco came along to Brands Hatch in 2004.

Race Event #1 description:

Dual Hybrid/Special (Saturday)

60/70 Cones, spacing between 2 to 3 metres.

Giant Slalom (Sunday) – Brands lends itself ideally to GS courses – in fact probably the best hill in the UK to run a GS.

80+ cones, spacing anywhere from 2 to 3 metres.

Very smooth asphalt race track. Pitch of hill is somewhere around 10% to 8% thereabouts.

The Hybrid/Special course will be set on Friday night/Saturday morning by Louis Selby and two visiting skaters.

The GS will be set by Mick Reiss plus a visiting skater.
